A VISUAL STORY

Visual stories are used to prepare a person for, and increase the predictability of a new environment or situation. This helps bring familiarity to a process and to reduce anxiety and stress. Visual stories are written in an easy to read format and use pictures to provide greater accessibility for everyone





ACCESSIBILITY

Madame Tussauds has a range of accessibility tools available. These include:

- Magnifying glass
- Magnifier strip
- Magnifier sheet
- •Ear plugs
- Noise-reducing ear protection

Madame Tussauds is wheelchair accessible. There are some activities inside that are not wheelchair accessible.

Mobility aids such as wheelchairs are available at no cost. I will have to leave my ID with reception. I will get my ID back when I return the wheelchair.

Assistance animals are welcome at the Madame Tussauds.

Madame Tussauds supports and recognizes the Hidden Disability Sunflower.

THE HIDDEN DISABILITIES SUNFLOWER LANYARDS

The Sunflower is a globally recognised symbol for Hidden Disabilities.

The lanyard is a way that people with Hidden Disabilities can indicate to staff that they may need extra support time and understanding.

It is OK if I don't have a lanyard, I can still get help if I need.

If I already have a Sunflower lanyard I can bring it with me.





SENSORY INFORMATION

During my visit to Madame Tussauds, I might come across different sensory experiences.

These include:

- Flashing lights
- Loud music
- Smoke machines
- Sudden loud noises
- Bright lights
- Crowds
- •Things I can touch, feel and interact with
- Dress up
- •Wax figures that look like real people

There are seats throughout Madame Tussauds where I can take a break if I need.

WHAT TO BRING TO MADAME TUSSAUDS

Sometimes it is busy, noisy, bright and loud at Madame Tussauds I can bring things to help me enjoy the day.

WHERE TO FIND MADAME TUSSAUDS


Madame Tussauds is located at 1-5 Wheat Road, Sydney NSW 2000 - Right next door to SEA LFIFE Aquarium and WILD LIFE Sydney Zoo!

Madame Tussauds is open at different times on different days.

I can check what times Madame Tussauds is open by visiting the opening hours section on the website

I will need a ticket to visit Madame Tussauds.

PARKING

I can park at one of the Wilson parking stations near by.

I can receive discounted parking at Wilson parking if I am visiting Madame Tussauds.

To get discounted parking I will need to:

- •Pre-book my parking online or via the Wilson Parking App
 - •Select from one of these car parks:
 - •100 Murray Street (Harbourside)
 - Citipark
 - Darling Park
 - •383 Kent Street
 - •321 Kent Street
 - •Enter the promo code 'MERLIN' before I pay

I can find the parking stations listed on the Madame Tussauds website.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Train

Madame Tussauds is a short walk from Town Hall or Wynyard train station.

Bus

If I have a ticket for Big Bus Sydney, I can ride to the Madame Tussauds stop on Wheat Road. I could also take any bus that goes to Market Street or King Street and walk down the hill to Darling Harbour.

Ferry

I can catch the Public ferry services to Darling Harbour.
The ferry will depart from Circular Quay (Wharf 5) every half an hour.

Light Rail

Madame Tussauds is a short walk from either the Convention Centre or Pyrmont Bay Light Rail stations.

WHAT TO EXPECT

There are lots of things to see and do at Madame Tussauds. These might include:

- Interactive activities
- Dressing up activities
- Singing and dancing activities
- •Wax figures that look like famous people
- Smoke machines
- •Places I can have my photo taken

There might be other things to see and do at Madame Tussauds, I can check on their website to see what is on before I visit.



TOILETS

There are toilets just inside Madame Tussauds.

They are located at the 'Australian History' exhibit.

I should try to use the toilet before I go into the rest of the exhibits.

If I need help to find a toilet I can ask a Madame Tussauds staff member.





RULES

There are rules that I need to follow inside Madame Tussauds to help keep me and the museum safe. The most important rules to remember are:

Rule 1: no rushing

- •I must not rush, run, push or hurry
- •I will walk slowly and be patient when I am in Madame Tussauds

Rule 2: no eating food or drinking inside Madame Tussauds

- •I must not eat inside Madame Tussauds
- •It is ok to drink from my water bottle if I need

Rule 3: I can touch the wax figures

• I can touch the figures but it's important to be gentle and respectful

The Madame Tussauds staff will help to remind me of the rules if I forget.

ENTERING MADAME TUSSAUDS

The entrance to Madame Tussauds is from Darling Harbour.

I may have to line up to get in.

After I enter I can have my photo taken by the staff.

If I do not want my photo taken I can say no.

I should wait for the people having their photo taken to finish before I walk past.

When I first enter Madame Tussauds there is loud music and sounds playing. I may want to wear noise-cancelling ear protection or headphones.

Sensory warning

- The camera uses a flash.
- This is very bright.
- I can wear sunglasses if I need.



History

The first area of Madame Tussauds is History. Here I can learn about Madame Tussaud and many Australian figures.

There are props and interactives that I can touch to learn about the figures.

There are bathrooms in this area that I can use if I need.

World Leaders

In the world Leaders area, I can learn about a lot of important leaders in history. I will see figures of the royal family.

I am allowed to take photos with all the figures in Madame Tussauds.

I can interact with all the props and interactive screens in this area.

There are lots of areas where I can take photos or use interactives to play sport-related games.

There may be some loud sudden noises in this area, so I may want to wear my noise-canceling ear protection or headphones.

In the Pride zone, I will see figures of a lot of Pride Icons.

There are lots of areas where I can interact and sit for photo opportunities.

There are a lot of bright lights so I may want to wear sunglasses or a hat.

In this area, I will see figures of different musicians and singers.

I can interact with items in this area and use props that I find in this area to take photos with.

There will be a lot of sudden and loud noises in this area, so I may want to wear my sound-canceling ear protection or headphones.

In this area, I will see figures of different Marvel superheroes.

At the entrance to the Marvel zone, there is a loud interactive. I may want to wear my noise-canceling ear protection or headphones.

I can use the photo booth for an additional cost to take photos with a Marvel background.















Carnival Carnage

The Wax Museum has an additional experience called Carnival Carnage.

It is a short (4-5 minutes) 7D experience

Things I need to know about the Carnival Carnage Experience:

- I can choose to do the experience if I want to
- I do need an extra ticket (\$15 per person)
- I might have to line up and wait
- It is ok if I have to wait a long time, I will still get to ride
- Children under 12 years of age must be accompanied by an adult (18+) during the ride
- Carnival Carnage is a thrilling 7D experience with themes of violence that may not be suitable for young children
- The ride does move slightly, in addition with strobe lights, and wind effects

GIFT SHOP AT MADAME TUSSAUDS

Madame Tussauds has a gift shop, it is located near the exit.

EATING & DRINKING

I must not eat inside Madame Tussauds.

I can bring my own food with me if I want to.

If I have a card with me I can buy food from the SEALIFE café near Madame Tussauds.

The café sells pies, pastries, sandwiches and drinks.





WHO TO ASK FOR HELP IF NEEDED

I can ask Madame Tussauds staff for help if I need.

Madame Tussauds staff wear a red shirt.

I can find staff throughout Madame Tussauds or at the front desk.

LEAVING MADAME TUSSAUDS

When I am finished at Madame Tussauds I can leave.

If I am with a group or my family I should wait for them to be finished too.

I can visit Madame Tussauds another day If I would like.
